"What about the judgment of God? We read in the Bible, in the end times, of seeing droughts and famine and all sorts of plagues coming upon our land. Do you think this is something like that?"

Robertson

"... There is no question that natural disasters in Biblical times have been regarded as a sign of God's judgment calling for repentance. When you have earthquakes, when you have drought, when you have natural disasters one after the other, it's time for people not only to ration water, but to get on their knees and pray for rain and repent.

"... If we don't repent, we will be in ten years more like Argentina than like America of the 1960s. We're going down here very rapidly. ... We've got some serious problems. The tumor ... at the heart of America's soul, that's got to be addressed: the rebellion against God, the fornication, the adultery, the homosexuality, the idol worship, the Satanism. All these things put together, coupled with the Supreme Court of the United States shaking its fist at God and kicking God out of our classrooms and out of our public life -- God is offended. It's just a matter of time before he judges America."

Testimonies and Robertson's lesson on "spiritual warfare" rounded out the program.

"Let me remind you that today is a special day. We are going to point out some of the things that are happening in the courts of America. They haven't stopped. I read yesterday that People For the American Way is complaining about the appointment of a circuit court judge. You know why? Because when he was a lawyer, he represented some Jewish synagogues and some Christian churches as a lawyer. And as a result, People For the American Way, that leftist organization founded by Norman Lear, says that he isn't qualified to be a federal judge because some of his clients were churches and synagogues. Now that's how far it's gone.

"The courts -- many of them are doing wonderful work, but many of them also are extraordinarily liberal. Now, we need help if we're going to bring the truth to you. The war in the Gulf will be over. The other war that we're talking about, the spiritual war, isn't even really warming up. But there's going to be an intensity in the next several years that -- just like those Iraqi soldiers have to be rooted out of their positions, even so, some of these who hold positions of power in the media, in films, in the courts, in education, in various spheres of our life, they've got to be replaced by people who have a view of the Constitution that coincides with what the founders of this country believed, and who do not take this ultra-liberal, socialistic viewpoint on things."

Falwell's sermon was titled, "What does the Bible say about war and this conflict with Saddam Hussein?" This was a comprehensive essay on his own view of the war. He defended Bush's policy in the Persian Gulf using the "just war" principle. He examined each point of the doctrine and concluded that indeed, this is a justifiable war in theological terms. He then addressed the issue of Armageddon and strongly stated that this is not Armageddon, nor is it directly related to it.
