"He's black, he's homosexual, he's got AIDS and he could be this summer's version of the Mapplethorpe controversy. Thirty-four-year-old Marlon Riggs' NEA-funded documentary entitled "Tongues Untied" is so sexually and verbally explicit, well over a dozen public broadcasting stations across the country are refusing to air it. "Tongues Untied" will run as part of PBS's summer "Point of View" series, which is funded by the National Endowment for the Arts. Scheduled for 10 PM Eastern time on July 16, "Tongues Untied" is about homosexual black men and includes full frontal nudity, kissing men, profanity and racial and homosexual slang. Riggs also received \$5000.00 from the NEA for "Tongues Untied." American Family Association president Don Wildmon says for once he hopes the film is widely distributed so that people can "see for themselves where their tax money is being spent."

"If they oppose Clarence Thomas, if the Democrats who oppose the Senate vote him down, George Bush has got them. Because, the next nominee is not going to be a black its going to be an Hispanic and if the democrats then vote down the Hispanic, then George Bush's next nominee is going to be a woman. And if the Democrats vote down a woman, they're going to the 1992 elections against blacks, against hispanics and against women...Doug Wilder who's a black Governor in Virginia, says he think we should question Clarence Thomas because Clarence Thomas is a Roman Catholic. So he introduces religion into the debate because a Roman Catholic would be against the slaughter of babies.
