Robertson:

That judge should be impeached!

Walsh:

He does not have the right to do what he is doing?

Robertson:

Listen, there may be some obscure law I'm not aware of, but the conduct of the streets of Kansas City is the province of the state of Kansas and its judiciary. This is not a federal issue, it is reserved by the constitution to the states, it is not in any way taken under the Supreme Court of the United States or the federal courts. I don't know how they can stretch this to say somehow this is not state action. This is private action against private people who are taking life, and that should be settled in the state courts...

Walsh:

This clinic provides third trimester abortions, it's an absolute slaughterhouse.

Robertson:

Well, it should be stopped, and this man, I don't know if Kelly, if he's Irish Catholic, if he is he's denying his religious beliefs...and to say he's going to go against churches and loot their property in the name of killing babies, that's outrageous.

Walsh:

What happens if a pastor comes and stands as an individual and says I take a stand against this, how can a court then go after his church treasurer's funds for the church? Can they do that?

Robertson:

Only if they are completely runamok, and that judge apparently is runamok.

Robertson:

There's only one type of sex education that's been successful and that's abstinence. And that's been working and the ACLU, if you can believe it, has tried to make it illegal to teach abstinence.

Robertson:

Robertson:

We are up against a situation of a media blackout, a media bias

that is so palpable and so heavy the average American does not get the truth about these issues at all. And these people are not objective purveyors of truth, they are partisans of one particular point of view.

Walsh:

That seems ridiculous to us at the moment, but go back a few generations and abortion would have seemed ridiculous to us. Abortion has opened the door to killing off people who are too old, who are of no use to society. It happens so gradually and insidiously that things you never would have accepted once, you now accept.

Robertson:

Well, the people who are so vehemently, vehemently behind the establishment of the New World Order are also behind Planned Parenthood with big dollars, I'm talking a hundred million dollars worth of money. They are terrified about global population expansion. And so take people out at the upper end, to take them out at the lower end is part of the plan. of the "New World Order" so it's all fitting together...
