Robertson and Walsh approved of Bush's idea of providing vouchers rather than having a nationalized system.

Robertson:

"You are guaranteed the poor will be stealing from it like they do from food stamps and everything else. There's always a small criminal element who are misusing these programs but the vast majority of the poor people need help and they're honest honorable people. The vouchers are far, far better than anything else."

Walsh:

Robertson:

"We must establish in this country that nobody has the right to get money from the government. The government is giving one class of poor people money and discriminating against five of them then they have a right to it like everybody else. But in

terms of art nobody has a right to money to do obscene pictures.

Walsh:

I wonder what's going to happen. I know Frohnmayer's stepping down. I wonder who the new person will be who takes his place.

Robertson:

I think he's like the babies they threw out of the sleigh to appease the wolves. I think the administration feels the wolves yapping at the sleigh. . .I hope they get somebody stronger but it is a tough lobby these guys are up against. . .best thing to do I think would be to scrap the agency and let funding for art be a private business and private donations."

Robertson:

"It isn't a question of censorship ladies and gentlemen, we're not talking about censorship. We're talking about taking the money that you and I work for and pay in taxes and using it to attack what we believe. The idea of a poem funded by your taxpayer money making Jesus Christ, the son of God, a pedophile, molesting a six-year-old behind a church pulpit is about as awful as it can possibly be. And this Frohnmayer is defending that again. And I would recommend strongly that you write the White House in Washington DC and just express your outrage, that this man needs to be dismissed from his position. And as a matter of fact I agree with Sheila that the United States Government needs to get out of the art business. We have studied and learn that it's close to \$2 billion dollars a year that comes into the arts from private corporations and the amount of money spent by the federal government is relatively small, \$160-70 million dollars. But it's the principle of the thing that's so awful, its giving legitimacy and the imprimatur of the federal government to conduct that's illegal in some states and is certainly repugnant and abhorrent to a large percentage of the taxpayers of this nation."
