**Robertson announced that Jay Sekulow was joining the American Center for Law and Justice as the General Counsel.**

Sekulow said if Lee v. Weisman is decided as they expect, they would get about 500 new cases to pursue.

**Robertson:**

"Children are being beat up by humanist teachers...it's happening every day."

**Robertson:**

"You know I have trouble believing that somebody from Tupelo, Mississippi would get every network executive in America upset, would bring down the wrath of **Norman Lear**, what in the world do you do?"

**Wildmon:**

"...In fact, Chrysler recently announced that they would probably drop all of their money spent in prime time programming on the networks, and one of the reasons was because of the filth that the networks are now into."

**Wildmon:**

"Ten years from now, the networks as we know them. . .I don't think will exist. They'll be gone... The networks are two things, morally offensive and mentally insulting."

(Talking about pornographers who have been prosecuted by the government and others)

**Robertson:**

"There are rumors, and I don't have any facts, but there are some pretty hard rumors that some of those people like Steerman and others have funnelled money to advocacy groups, ACLU etc. to fight against the pornography laws. Is that true? "

**Wildmon:**

"Well I think that two people sleep in the same bed if you want to know the truth of the matter, to put it in their language. The porn industry just about three days ago ran a full page ad in Variety saying we're a legitimate entertainment industry, come over and help us because they're going to come get you next. Their morals and values are pretty much the same."

**Robertson:**

You know, I was speaking to Mark DeMoss, whose mother you know is head of the DeMoss Foundation, which has been running those very interesting ads for adoption, and he said that the three networks will not run them, they won't put them on the air. They don't even want to hear of a choice to adopt babies. This media is so slanted against life that they won't even let somebody talk about it. . .the most feminine thing a woman can do is have a baby. So those who are opposed to marriage and procreation in the normal way are totally against this, they're against women who have an enormous advantage over them if they can have a baby. that's a very feminine thing, it's a unique thing a woman can do. So this isn't a woman's right to have an abortion, it's a woman's right to be a lesbian and to be involved in this radical feminist movement.

Robertson:

It is the most incredible thing, this anti-Christ spirit that has been spreading across America...whenever that spirit of death is abroad in the land, nobody's safe.

NEWSDESK:

- "Bailey for Life, for Congress" ads case thrown out of court for filing the suit incorrectly.

--Bush, meeting with Evangelicals at the White House April 21, said he is against passing special laws to protect the rights of homosexuals and that he would veto the Freedom of Choice Act.

-New baseball-type cards with mass murderers and criminals, the "True Crime Trading Cards." Two New York lawmakers are trying to make them unavailable to minors.

-Earth Day and the extremism of the Environmental Movement. Includes David Rothbard, president of CFACT, Committee for a Constructive Tomorrow, and Pat Michaels of the University of Virginia, both of whom try to "debunk the myths" of the environmental movement, liberal claims of an impending environmental apocalypse. Greenpeace, says the report is a "radical environmental group" with a "left-wing social agenda which is, at its core, utopian and anti-capitalist."

**Robertson:**

One cult, particularly New-Agers, are calling for two billion people to die, they want them to die. They bought into this death thing. If you can get people off the earth, they won't pollute, or take up the ozone. And let's save the trees and kill the people.
