Robertson:

Allan Carlson, the Rockford Institute:

"Their whole image of themselves as an individual has been captured by their sexual desire and their sexual propensities. And to see that challenged and judged and labeled as sinful creates a rage that can only be satisfied, that can only be answered by denying the ability of others to judge them."

Pat Robertson:

"The concept, the word for homosexual behavior is sodomy. That is what is used in the official documents. It is sodomy. It is repugnant. It has been prohibited and proscribed by sane society throughout countless millennia, centuries, people have understood this is wrong. Now in America, not only is it happening, it is getting civil rights protection in the law and these people are now invading churches. This isn't a question of their rights. It is a question of them coming in and putting blood filled condoms into communion plates, in spattering blood in St. Patrick's Cathedral, of entering into churches and making disruptions. They wanted to target our Founder's Inn here, until we fortunately were able to get some information from inside the group and therefore frustrate their plans...But why can't they leave Christians alone? They won't do that because they understand we say it's sin. It is wrong, and we say it boldly, and they do not want to be told that their lifestyle is sinful. But God's word is immutable and we will violate it at our peril. So we now have a country ladies and gentlemen that permits blasphemy in our motion pictures, blasphemy in our literature, blasphemy in our television, blasphemy in our school rooms and classrooms and in our colleges and universities, that not only accepts homosexuality but protects it, and allows a Supreme Court to continue, which has ruled God and the Bible out of our classes and prohibited the State from any observance, if you will, of religious practices that have been time-honored in our society. And how long do we think we're going to continue that way without God almighty bringing judgement on our land? The answer is not much longer...When you see a cover story in Life magazine saying 'Has Nature Gone Mad?', you begin to get the message. Nature hasn't gone mad, but God almighty is lifting the protection that has been on this nation for so long."

"To say that this is homophobic to love and pray and counsel and care for homosexuals and lesbians is nonsense because we want to help them. But at the same time when they want to come into

churches and disrupt church services and throw blood all around and try to give people AIDS and spit in the face of ministers in public hearings and things like that, that's not very good behavior."

And we have a Supreme Court that has turned it's back on God. Occasionally it comes through with some good rulings. But the basic rulings of the Supreme Court are that it's permissible to give people the right to slaughter innocent babies, and at the same time it is impermissible for children in schools to have organized official prayer or study of the Bible. And all of this has been as if we've poked our finger officially into the eye of a righteous, holy God."
