Bauer:

"The bill is so vague. It's so unspecific in its provisions. It's going to be a field day for lawyers and judges and bureaucrats, and the bottom line is going to be that a lot of Americans are going to find it difficult to petition their government, even though the First Amendment guarantees them that right."

"The crew that runs Washington D.C., the Washington establishment, is really upset that more and more Americans are finding out what they're up to....Now, because of alternative media, because of shows like your's, because of groups like the Family Research Council, the American people are finding out about these things, and the politicians in this town just don't like it and they want to shut us down."

"There's a reporting provision in it, that the way it is written, could require any organization literally to turn over their membership list to the federal government, to an appointee that would be appointed by the president."

Robertson:

"Each place [colony] was started by men and women who had a burning desire to establish a just government, based on the principles of the Bible, primarily in this case, The Old

Testament, because they figured that this was a renewal of the Biblical Israel...That's the heritage we had in America. That was the belief system of our nation, until our nation was captured slowly and steadily by those who had an agenda to take our courts, to take our schools, to take our institutions of government and twist them away from the clear intentions of the Founding Fathers, and move them toward an atheistic, culturally relative, humanistic world view that embraced some form of the European socialism. And in the manifestos they wrote, that's precisely what their goal was, and, regrettably, it happened. And so this great land, in a sense, has been taken captive by not the majority of people, but by a tiny minority of people who have manipulated the institutions of power to enslave the vast numbers of people who don't agree with them. And I believe that we have been called to declare liberty once again in this nation, and to see the yolk of oppression of this cruel liberalism broken, and a rebirth of freedom according to intentions of the framers of this country to be established."

Susan Hirschmann:

"Many of the concerns, or most of the concerns that we had with the Equal Rights Amendment are wrapped in here. I really do think it would be an international equal rights amendment."

Robertson:

"What happened is those of us who are Christian, those of us who are Jewish in the conservative sense, those Muslims, or whoever from a more conservative, theistic background are being pressured constantly by initiatives by a small group of social planners who are humanists, socialist, and leftists, of course all of them are leftists. And they seem to worm their way into the councils of the United States, certainly of the United Nations....Just like this citizens' gag law [the lobbying reform bill] that's been put in. Here you've got a bunch of leftists in the Senate and the House, slipping something into a conference that nobody debates,

and trying to put it through to muzzle people. This again is to destroy the Judeo-Christian framework of family life in America. Here is one more attempt to do it, to do it through the backdoor. They couldn't pass the E.R.A, because the American people didn't want it, so here they're going to slide it under a U.N. treaty. And, ladies and gentlemen, this is a dangerous tendency, but we've got to come to the point where we are in the ascendancy. But you can assume that the left-wing media is going to be hammering you, and the left-wing in the political spectrum is going to be hammering you until sooner or later the Christians assert themselves, and their conservative Jewish friends, altogether move to establish the way it should be in this world."
