But there is a wall that protects us all from evil. This is the wall of faith, and this is the wall of Biblical values that have stood this nation for the years and the centuries of its existence. And that wall has been torn down by assaults from the left, having to do with killing of babies, having to do with taking religious values from our midst, having to do with the destruction of moral values, with drug addiction, with murder, with crime, with drunkenness, with all these things. And it's time that we see God almighty put his great wall of protection around us."

Sekulow:

"The erosion of the 60s has In think in a very real way become the victory of the 90s. There was an erosion in the 1960s, there's no doubt about it. Christians were relegated to non-existence in a lot of arenas, not all arenas but a lot of arenas."

Robertson:

"We will not allow little children, their rights to be trampled on in the public schools anymore, it's not going to happen. That was one of the reasons there was such an overwhelming electoral shift in November. One of the network announcers, the anchor on ABC who will remain nameless, said American voters were having a temper tantrum, like two year children. There was no temper tantrum. American voters were very calm and collected to say, 'We don't like the liberal media, we don't like the ACLU and People For the American Way and the gay rights caucus and these others taking away our freedom. We don't like the elimination of our moral values from the public square...And we are going to put people in office who are going to change the laws to get them back to the way they used to be.' And you hear the chorus of screams now, 'Oh, you might bring back prayer to the schools.' Well, isn't that terrible. We have drugs in the school, we have teenage pregnancy, we're giving out condoms to little children against their parents' will in junior high school. And yet there's this hue and cry that somehow saying a prayer to God is going to affect their children. That is nonsense."

Robertson:

"We're not going to let our freedoms in this nation to be taken away by a group of left-wing ideologue who really don't believe in anything. And they have sway over this government and the courts of this government for decades and over this nation for decades. And suddenly this hold has been broken, and they're just screaming like stuck pigs."

And then progressing, liberals, most of them atheistic educators, have pushed to remove all religion from the lives of children...The people who wrote the "Humanist Manifesto" and their pupils and their disciples are in charge of education in America today. And they believe that your child at age 6 and 7 and 8 and 9 and 10 and 11 should be taught humanistic sex

education. Here's how you do it. It's a mechanical function. It's something that's a lot of fun. Here's how homosexuals do it. Here's how lesbians do it...In every instance where abstinence-based sex education is being taught in the school -- the old-fashioned morality -- the children are reporting much fewer cases of pregnancy out of wedlock, obviously much fewer cases of sexually transmitted diseases. But when the school board down in the Jacksonville, Florida area, in that county, brought in an abstinence-based program, the Planned Parenthood sued them and they said this a violation of the United States Constitution, because abstinence-based sex [education] is a religious doctrine and therefore we cannot have religion in the schools. Now you talk about absurd, but that's how crazy Planned Parenthood and their allies are."

"Let's fight the National Education Association. Let's fight Planned Parenthood. Let's fight the ACLU. And let's beat them. Let's not just sit back and say they're supposed to be in charge. They're not. They're interlopers. They've got no business being in charge of a country that was founded by Godly people."
